large team of science and engineering students at the University of BC is preparing to defend its title at the 7th International Robotic Sailing Championships to be held at Olin College, Boston MA, June 9 through 13. Last year's UBC team won the event on home waters (jointly sponsored event by UBC and the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club) with a new record 47 out of 50 possible points scored over several days of challenging racing and manoeuvring designed to test the abilities of the boats in both PC and autonomous modes. This year's crew, under returning team captain Krisstoffer Vik Hansen and team advisor Don Martin, includes 31 first-through fourth-year UBC students in Electrical, Computer and Integrated Engineering, and, Computer and Allied Science.

Construction of Thunderbird 2013 was completed in early spring and on-water testing and programming development continues until May 25 when the boat will be packed and shipped to Boston.
